## Judicial Center Pavement Improvement Project – Part I

The Kane County Judicial Center had more than 123,000 visitors in 2024, projected to increase to 143,000 in 2025. This volume necessitates the need for pavement improvements to (a) prevent accidents, (b) maintain the structural integrity of the County's investments, (c) prevent further deterioration and (d) reduce maintenance costs. The project will reduce hazards caused by collapsed sewers, potholes, cracks, uneven pavement and poor drainage issues. The repairs encompass the Judicial Center (*photos above*), Sheriff's Department, jail parking lots and private entrance drives. The October issue will showcase improvements to help alleviate parking at the Sheriff's Department and Jail.

## Recycling Process Updates

Building Management is continuing to centralize and streamline recycling efforts countywide. Changes will begin at the Government Center with new educational signage (pictured) in Building A and will gradually expand to other areas.



## Attention: Testing Continues

In September, Building Management will continue testing the heating systems in anticipation of the upcoming fall/winter weather. During testing, building occupants may notice a burning smell. This is normal and should only last approximately 5-10 minutes. Call (630) 444-3400 with any questions.
