Re: Electronic Equipment Recycling

The City of Geneva and Kane County have partnered together to make it more convenient for you to dispose of your used electronic equipment. The Geneva Public Works Department located at 1800 South St. has a large container just inside the gate area on the west side of the building where you can place your used electronic equipment. The site is open and accessible to the public Monday through Friday (excluding Holidays) between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. This is a self-service program. Residents should take their items directly to the large container and stack their equipment inside.

- Fluorescent bulbs
- Liquids and gases
